2020 Topics for Wagin Camera Club

February: Local Scene ~ to be taken within a 30 kms radius of Wagin. A new Woolorama topic and sponsored by the Wagin Chamber of Commerce. The winner will received \$100 prize money & the winning image will be used for the Chamber of Commerce annual calendar.

March: Wildflower/s ~The image must be of an uncultivated variety, growing freely without human intervention. It can be of a single or multiply blooms.

April: Starburst ~ Create a Starburst effect day or night scene. Check website <https://digital-photography-school> or other sites for ideas.

May: Albany Interclub Topic -To be confirmed. Entries close end of July.

June: Sculpture/s ~ Create an image showing humour with the sculpture structure. Could use this topic for Gymkhanarama Exhibition?

July: Australian Landscape ~ May show water but must not dominate the landscape. Definition to be confirmed. (This is a Woolorama major section offering \$300 prize money to winning photo)

August: WCC Woolorama Interclub Topic ~ to be confirmed.

Sept: In The Shearing Shed ~ An image of anything involved with sheep shearing and/or wool handling. Be creative.

October: Portrait – (This is another Woolorama major section offering \$300 prize money) Definition to be confirmed. Perhaps we can ask Melanie English as a quest speaker earlier in year re Portraits?

November: See below for suggestions:

Long Exposure – but with a twist. Be creative with the light in your photo. Whether it's a burst of sun, or a flash of light, it doesn't matter as long as it's with a long exposure.

Mother Nature At Her Best: Can be thunder clouds, lightening, dust storms, rough & rugged coast line, to beautiful sunset scenes

Water: Water can enhance macro shots, challenge would be to take a macro or close up shot incorporating water in your image. Eg find a good natural light and shoot towards a dark background to make your subject stand out.
